Applying for the Saint Mary's University Entrance Awards Program? **Start here!**

What is the Entrance Awards Program?

The Entrance Awards Program was established by Saint Mary's University with the support of alumni, staff, community members and businesses, with the intent of meeting a variety of student needs through scholarships, bursaries and awards. By completing this Entrance Awards Program Application, you will be considered for approximately 75 awards based on a broad range of eligibility criteria, such as community involvement, extra-curricular activities, academic achievement and/or financial need.

Who is eligible?

To be eligible, you must be a new student entering an undergraduate program at Saint Mary's University, directly from high school. You must also have completed an <u>undergraduate application</u> and be accepted (or admissible) by February 15, 2026.

How do I apply?

To be considered, students must complete the online <u>Entrance Awards Program Application</u> by **February 15, 2026**.

This guide will go through the Entrance Awards Program Application question-by-question, so you know what to expect and what information to prepare in advance. Part 1 is required of all applicants, while Parts 2 and 3 are only required for students wishing to be considered for specific awards. Keep in mind that not every question will be relevant to every applicant.



Application Instructions & Overview

Part 1 (Required): General Entrance Awards

Part 2 (Optional): Financial Need-Based Entrance Awards

- Only required if you wish to be considered for Entrance Awards that take into consideration your financial need.
- Must submit a statement of financial need (no minimum length required, but no more than 500 words).

Part 3 (Optional): Presidential/Presidential International Baccalaureate/Santamarian Scholarships & Sobey National Innovator Scholarships

- Only required if you wish to be considered for these specific awards, which have additional eligibility criteria.
- Must submit a 750-word personal essay based on your community involvement,
 contribution to school life and plans for the future.
- For the Sobey National Innovator Scholarship only, you must also submit a resume and a letter of recommendation from a high school Principal, Guidance Counsellor, or teacher.

Sobey National Innovator Scholarships for Bachelor of Commerce Students

The Sobey National Innovator Scholarship (Sobey Innovator) is presented to exceptional students from across Canada, in recognition of their accomplishments and as encouragement and support for their success in the Sobey School of Business. These scholarships are open to Canadian citizens and Permanent Residents of Canada entering the Bachelor of Commerce program at Saint Mary's University. To be eligible, applicants must demonstrate leadership in extra-curricular activities and have an average of 90% or higher, or an IB Diploma score of 36. To be considered, the following supporting document(s) are required:

- A 750-word essay that describes your community involvement, contribution to school life and plans for the future. This could include participation in student government, athletic achievement, extra-curricular activities, volunteer and/or paid work.
- A copy of your resume.
- A letter of recommendation from a high school Principal, Guidance Counsellor or teacher.

I'm applying for the Presidential, Santamarian and/or the Sobey National Innovator Scholarship. What should my essay include?

You are so much more than a grade average or a GPA, and your personal essay is your chance to show us who you really are! Your essay should touch on the following topics:

- Your education and career goals. What do you want to do with your degree after you graduate? Are you planning to continue your education or enter the work force?
- Your academic achievements. Academic excellence can look different for every student tell us about an academic achievement you're proud of.
- Your involvement within your school or community. This could include participation in student government, student societies, athletics, volunteerism, etc.
- Your extra-curricular commitments. Are you a member of any sports teams, clubs or working part-time? Share how you balance your responsibilities.
- Your interests and hobbies. Are you an entrepreneur, an artist or a musician? Tell us what you're passionate about and how it shapes your activities and goals.
- Any challenges you've overcome and anything that makes you unique. Everyone
 has a story. If you've faced obstacles or experiences that set you apart, we want to
 hear about them.

Using AI tools when brainstorming or working on the rough draft is fine, but the final essay should be in your own words. When we read 500 essays, the ones that stand out are those that sound the most human. Your authentic voice is far more engaging than a literary masterpiece with flawless grammar and a thesaurus's worth of synonyms (unless you are a writer or poet, in which case we want to hear all about it in your essay!).

Remember, this is your story – be honest, be thoughtful, and most importantly, be yourself.
